ON TRACK MILDENHALL

On Track Education in Mildenhall is a small independent special school for pupils aged 11 to 16 with behavioural, emotional and social difficulties. The school has been established for 15 years and was last inspected by Ofsted in March 2023, receiving judgements of 'good' in all categories. Our pupils engage in an interesting and inspiring curriculum that leads them to gain accreditation, including a range of GCSEs, BTEC and Level 1 / Level 2 qualifications.

Swift House is based in Quidenham, Norfolk and is a new satellite school of our Mildenhall school.

Swift House is set in stunning scenery on a very peaceful country estate. Phase one of the project will primarily cater for pupils with ASD or ASD traits at Key stages 3 and 4. The second phase of The Swift House project will open in 2024.



Swift House provides a full curriculum up to GCSE level along with additional enrichment opportunities. Both Schools are working towards becoming Thrive Schools of Excellence and Eco Schools.

Both the Mildenhall School and Swift House, aim to develop positive attitudes to learning and to prepare pupils with the diverse skills and knowledge needed, for a successful transition into further education, employment and beyond.

RECRUITMENT AND SELECTION STATEMENT

The safe recruitment of staff is the first step in the effective safeguarding and promoting the welfare of our pupils. On Track Education is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. It is recognised that this can only be achieved through sound procedures, good inter-agency co-operation and the recruitment and retention of competent, motivated employees who are suited to, and fulfilled in the roles they undertake.

On Track Education recognises the value of, and seeks to achieve a diverse workforce which includes people from different backgrounds, with different skills and abilities. On Track Education is committed to ensuring that the recruitment and selection process is conducted in a manner that is systematic, efficient, effective and promotes equality of opportunity. Selection will be on the basis of merit and ability, assessed against the qualifications, skills and competencies required to do the job. On Track Education will uphold its obligations under law to not discriminate against applicants.

On Track Education will implement robust recruitment procedures and checks for appointing staff and volunteers to ensure that reasonable steps are taken not to appoint a person who is unsuitable to work with children, or who is disqualified from working with children, or does not have the suitable skills and experience for the intended role.

The following pre-employment checks will be required:

- Receipt of at least two satisfactory references, one from most recent employer*
- verification of the candidate's identity
- a satisfactory enhanced DBS check (including barred list information)
- verification of the candidate's mental and physical fitness for the post
- verification of qualifications
- verification of professional status where required e.g. QTS status (unless properly exempted)
- the production of evidence of the right to work in the UK
- a check for a teacher prohibition order
- a check for a section 128 direction (for management positions)
- online searches may be conducted on shortlisted candidates to help identify any issues that are publicly available

NB It is illegal for anyone who is barred from working with children to apply for, or work in our schools in any voluntary or paid capacity.

- On Track Education will contact current and previous employers, if an applicant is shortlisted, as part of pre-appointment checks. In exceptional circumstances, where you have good reason not to want your referees to be contacted prior to interview, you should set out your reasons with your application form. On Track Education will liaise with you and where they agree to defer in such cases, referees will be contacted immediately after interview and before an offer of employment is made.
- If the person has lived or worked outside the UK, further checks will be carried out, including overseas criminal record checks and obtaining a letter of professional standing from the professional regulating authority in the relevant country or countries

RECRUITMENT AND SELECTION STATEMENT

On Track Education will take up any discrepancies or anomalies in the information provided or issues arising from references at interview. On Track Education will contact current and previous employers of those applicants. On Track Education will keep and maintain a single central record of recruitment and vetting checks, in line with the statutory requirements.

On Track Education requires all staff and volunteers who are convicted or cautioned for any offence during their employment to notify the school, in writing of the offence and penalty.

All posts within On Track Education are exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 and therefore all applicants will be required to declare spent and unspent convictions, cautions and bind-overs, including those regarded as spent and have an Enhanced Criminal Records Disclosure. 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JOB PURPOSE

- To deliver engaging and meaningful English education that enables pupils to develop their literacy, communication skills, confidence and enjoyment of the subject while making meaningful progress towards appropriate qualifications and GCSEs.
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 - You will create an inclusive and supportive learning environment in which pupils can
 - develop their reading, writing and spoken English skills. Working with small groups and individual pupils, you will adapt teaching to reflect different starting points, learning needs and interests, helping pupils overcome barriers to learning and achieve their potential.
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JOB DESCRIPTION

Teaching and learning responsibilities

- Teach English to secondary-aged pupils, ensuring they develop their knowledge, literacy skills and confidence while making meaningful progress towards agreed outcomes and appropriate qualifications.
- Plan and deliver a sequenced and engaging English curriculum that builds knowledge and skills systematically and prepares pupils for GCSEs and other appropriate qualifications.
- Deliver clear, structured lessons that embed key concepts and support pupils to retain and apply their learning.
- Develop pupils' reading, writing, speaking and listening skills and promote literacy across their learning.
- Set personalised learning targets for each pupil, taking account of prior attainment, individual needs, EHCP outcomes and wider developmental goals.
- Adapt teaching approaches, resources and activities to reflect the SEN and individual learning needs of each pupil.
- Develop and adapt English resources to make learning accessible, using appropriate scaffolding and structured approaches to support different levels of literacy, communication and processing.
- Create accessible and engaging learning experiences that encourage participation, curiosity and confidence.
- Use a range of teaching methods to engage pupils who may previously have experienced barriers to learning or disengagement from education.
- Work collaboratively with the Headteacher, leadership team and wider school staff to ensure the curriculum meets the needs of all pupils.
- Contribute to cross-curricular learning and wider school activities where appropriate.

Student support and wellbeing

- Build positive, professional and trusting relationships with pupils.
 - Create a calm, supportive and inclusive classroom environment in which pupils feel safe, valued and able to participate.
 - Support pupils' social, emotional and personal development alongside their academic progress.
 - Promote positive behaviour, engagement and attitudes towards learning.
 - Recognise and respond appropriately to individual barriers to learning.
 - Work closely with colleagues to provide consistent and personalised support for pupils.
 - Encourage pupils to develop confidence, resilience and increasing independence.
 - Support pupils to recognise their achievements and develop greater confidence in their own abilities.
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Assessment and progress

- Regularly assess and monitor pupil understanding, progress and achievement.
- Use assessment information to identify individual strengths, gaps in knowledge and barriers to learning.
- Adapt planning and teaching in response to assessment outcomes.
- Provide timely and targeted intervention where additional support is required.
- Set and review personalised learning targets which reflect pupils' starting points and individual needs.
- Maintain appropriate records of progress and achievement.
- Contribute to pupil reviews, reporting processes and discussions about individual progress.
- Support pupils in working towards appropriate English and literacy qualifications, including GCSE and other suitable pathways according to individual ability and need.

Professional responsibilities

- Work collaboratively with the Headteacher, leadership team, teaching staff and other professionals involved in pupils' education and support to provide a consistent, personalised approach.
 - Contribute positively to the development of the English curriculum and wider school provision.
 - Participate in staff meetings, training and continuing professional development opportunities.
 - Maintain high professional standards and confidentiality at all times.
 - Promote equality, diversity and inclusion throughout your practice.
 - Comply with all school policies and procedures.
 - Maintain a strong understanding of safeguarding and child protection responsibilities and always promote and safeguard the welfare of children and young people.
