Social distancing and reducing risk of transmission	<ul> <li>Workforce roles, online training and competency established</li> <li>Full PPE provided and staff trained</li> <li>Guidelines to register and record results to be followed</li> <li>Quality assurance processes put in place</li> </ul>	
Groups of people gathering on school premises	<ul> <li>Pupils arrive on transport in small groups or individually</li> <li>Staff are present at arrival and departure times to encourage social distancing measures</li> <li>Lidded bin available for the safe disposal of face coverings</li> <li>Groups should be kept together throughout the school day where possible to reduce interaction across groups</li> <li>Staff supervise pupils during breaks to maintain social distancing</li> </ul>	The school has 18 students and 15 staff so we operate as a bubble, however we do ensure that groups of no more than 6 are together at any time.
Overcrowding in classrooms and corridors.	<ul> <li>Group sizes are limited to 4/5</li> <li>Desks are spaced as far apart as possible</li> <li>Interactions take place side to side, instead of face to face, wherever possible</li> </ul>	

Groups mixing during breaks and lunchtime compromising social distancing.	<ul> <li>Unnecessary furniture and furnishings are removed where practical to create space</li> <li>Staff are present to encourage social distancing and manage traffic around the school</li> <li>2m and direction arrows marked on the floor where appropriate</li> <li>Break and lunch times are taken at the same time across the school but staff and students should keep socially distanced. All students are encouraged to go outside for break and lunchtimes weather permitting.</li> <li>Lunch is delivered to each classroom for those that wish to remain indoors. This is limited to four people per classroom.</li> <li>Pupils eat their lunch in their classroom where they have been located for the lesson, except if they wish to go outdoors</li> </ul>	
	Staff are always present to encourage social distancing and manage break and lunchtime routines	
The use of face coverings	<ul> <li>The use of face coverings will be encouraged in corridors and communal areas for pupils, staff and visitors.</li> <li>During national lockdown regulations all staff must wear their face coverings in communal areas. All students will be encouraged to also wear face coverings when moving around the school.</li> <li>Where local restrictions apply</li> <li>When an area moves to Local COVID Alert Level: high or very high, face coverings must be worn by adults and pupils when moving around the premises, outside of classrooms, such as in corridors and communal areas where social distancing cannot easily be maintained.</li> <li>In the event of new local restrictions being agreed, we will to communicate quickly and clearly to staff, parents and pupils that the new arrangements require the use of face coverings in certain circumstances.</li> <li>Exemptions; Some individuals are exempt from wearing face coverings. This applies to; those who cannot put on, wear or remove a face covering because of a physical or mental illness or impairment or disability; speak to or provide assistance to someone who relies on lip reading, clear sound or facial expression to communicate.</li> </ul>

Floor markings to indicate social distancing and direction of traffic.	<ul> <li>One way systems are marked out with floor tape and wall signs</li> <li>Floor tape is used to mark out 2m distancing throughout communal areas of the school</li> </ul>	
Smaller rooms to comply with social distancing and safe working practice	<ul> <li>The number of pupils and staff in smaller rooms will be closely monitored</li> <li>Chairs will be removed / placed apart</li> </ul>	

	Desks will be forward facing where possible	
Ventilation to reduce spread	<ul> <li>Windows will be opened wherever temperatures allow and between classes</li> <li>Doors will be propped open, unless they are a fire door</li> <li>Where a room does not have natural ventilation, fans will be used to move air around in between classes</li> <li>Information for staff: </li></ul>	

Handwashing practice with children	<ul> <li>Each staff member is responsible for role modelling good hand washing practice</li> <li>Each staff member is responsible for encouraging pupils to wash their hands as appropriate</li> </ul>	
Good respiratory hygiene	<ul> <li>Each staff member is responsible for role modelling good respiratory hygiene</li> <li>Each staff member is responsible for encouraging pupils to 'catch it, bin it, kill it'</li> <li>Tissues are provided in every classroom and each staff member is responsible for replenishing these from the main supply</li> <li>Lidded bins are in all classrooms</li> </ul>	
Sufficient supplies of soap and cleaning products	Jade Merson is the staff member responsible for maintaining the main supply of these products	
Toilets being overcrowded	<ul> <li>Pupils are supervised at all times and only one person at a time will use the toilets</li> </ul>	
Staff related issues		
Staff measures to reduce contact and transmission	<ul> <li>Each staff member is responsible for following Covid-19 related guidance, including the use of face coverings</li> <li>It is a requirement for staff displaying Covid symptoms that they do not attend work</li> <li>If a staff member lives with a family member who is displaying symptoms they should not attend work</li> <li>If a staff member is contacted by Track and Trace and told to self-isolate they should not attend work</li> <li>Each staff member is responsible for keeping 2m ideally, or 1m, from anyone</li> <li>Hot desking will be avoided where possible</li> <li>Office spaces and staff rooms are arranged to support social distancing</li> <li>Staff meetings are held virtually or in small socially distanced groups</li> <li>Staff are able to leave site early to complete paperwork at home and also allowed to arrive on site later in the mornings. Wednesday the virtual staff meeting starts at 9am, but in general the staff school hours are 9.30-4pm</li> <li>During national lockdown those staff who are clinically extremely vulnerable will have a revised risk assessment and individual arrangements discussed</li> </ul>	Currently one member of staff is working from home during the lockdown due to CEV- delivery of remoter online teaching on 3 days per week.
Managing supply teachers, visitors, contractors and other temporary visiting staff.	<ul> <li>Clear Covid-19 related instructions are given to all visitors</li> <li>A record is kept of all visitors to the school</li> <li>Only essential visitors are permitted access to the school site when pupils and staff are present</li> </ul>	

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Insufficient staff capacity to deal with numbers of pupils - Shortage of teachers to maintain staff to pupil ratios	<ul> <li>School Closure Policy to be followed; consider how the school timetable can be modified to utilise the skills of staff available for the school to remain partially open; consider how a reduction in pupil numbers could allow for the school to remain open; if operation cannot be achieved, and with the agreement of the Directors, close or partially close the school and communicate the closure/partial/early closure to all relevant parties and update the school website</li> <li>Implement full programme of remote learning for pupils not on site</li> </ul>	
Anxiety levels of staff and community causing breakdown in staffing ratios,	Communicate the packages of support available; including support meetings,     BUPA employee assistance programme, HR advice

Conditions for use of fluid resistant face mask and other equipment when dealing with a symptomatic child are clear and understood by staff.	<ul> <li>If a pupil becomes unwell with symptoms of coronavirus and needs direct personal care until they can return home a face mask should be worn by the supervising adult if a distance of 2 meters cannot be maintained.</li> <li>If contact with the pupil is necessary, then gloves, an apron and a face mask should be worn by the supervising adult. If a risk assessment determines that there is a risk of splashing to the eyes, for example from coughing, spitting, or vomiting, then eye protection should also be worn</li> <li>Fluid resistant face masks, aprons and eye protection is available and a supply is maintained.</li> </ul>	
Assessment of all staff, including high risk staff with underlying health conditions or other risk factors	<ul> <li>Individual risk assessment undertaken and this risk assessment to be reviewed regularly and when there are local changes</li> <li>School maintains all actions outlined in this risk assessment to remain Covid secure;</li> </ul>

Pupil related issues		
Possible symptoms of Covid-19	<ul> <li>Staff check with pupils regarding symptoms on their arrival at school, including temperature taking with a non-contact thermometer</li> <li>Staff remain vigilant for developing symptoms throughout the day</li> <li>Pupils who are unwell with Covid symptoms will not attend school</li> <li>Pupils who live with anyone displaying Covid symptoms will not attend school</li> </ul>	
Pupil understanding	<ul> <li>Pupils know what the main symptoms of Covid are and know to report these if they develop symptoms, no matter how mild</li> <li>Pupils know to report any suspected family/friend Covid cases to staff</li> <li>Guidance is displayed around the school</li> <li>Staff work to encourage pupils to become advocates for disease prevention and control at home, in school, and in their community by talking to others about how to prevent the spread</li> </ul>	
Pupils unable to follow guidance	<ul> <li>Individual risk assessment updated accordingly and control measures introduced</li> <li>Consideration given to timetabling, staffing ratios, limited movement around site, outreach provision</li> </ul>	

Pupils equipment	<ul> <li>Pupils have been informed not to bring unnecessary equipment into school</li> <li>Pupils are provided with individual stationary and equipment wherever possible</li> <li>Equipment is cleaned down after every session</li> </ul>	
Member of a class becoming unwell with COVID-19	<ul> <li>If a pupil is awaiting collection, they will be moved to a room where they can be isolated behind a closed door and with appropriate adult supervision if required</li> <li>Ideally, a window should be opened for ventilation. If it is not possible to isolate them, move them to an area which is at least 2 meters away from other people</li> <li>Suitable rooms have been allocated for this purpose and communicate intentions to staff; First Aid room /Thrive room</li> <li>Suitable PPE (including fluid resistant face mask) is available at these locations</li> </ul>	
School Covid test kits	These may be offered in exceptional circumstances if an individual becomes symptomatic and they may have barriers to accessing testing elsewhere	
Remote learning	<ul> <li>If a pupil is self-isolating, remote learning will be provided by the school from the duration of their isolation</li> <li>Pupils will be provided with remote learning equipment as required</li> </ul>

Travel to school and provision of safe school transport:	Pupils are transported to school in local authority transport	
Travel in school vehicles	<ul> <li>Each journey will be risk assessed and only journeys which are necessary in order to meet pupil need are approved</li> <li>Each journey is approved in advanced by the SLT</li> <li>Pupils and staff must wear face coverings when travelling in school vehicles</li> <li>The windows should be open to the extent that temperature and weather conditions safely allow</li> <li>Social distancing measures should be maximized, including limiting numbers in vehicles if possible</li> <li>Hand sanitizer should be used by pupils and staff at the start and end of each journey</li> <li>Staff are responsible for sanitizing interior and exterior vehicle touch points before and after every journey</li> </ul>	
Travel in staff cars	<ul> <li>Each journey will be risk assessed and only journeys which are necessary in order to meet pupil need are approved</li> <li>Each journey is approved in advanced by the SLT</li> </ul>	

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Curriculum considerations	<ul> <li>Pupils and staff must wear face coverings when travelling in vehicles</li> <li>The windows should be open to the extent that temperature and weather conditions safely allow</li> <li>Social distancing measures should be maximized, including limiting numbers in vehicles if possible</li> <li>Hand sanitizer should be used by pupils and staff at the start and end of each journey</li> <li>Staff are responsible for sanitizing interior and exterior vehicle touch points before and after every journey</li> </ul>	
Music activities	<ul> <li>Pupils will be positioned back to back or side to side and social distancing maximised</li> <li>Any music activity will take place in a well ventilated area or room</li> <li>Instruments will be sanitised before and after use</li> <li>Instruments will not be shared</li> </ul>	
Physical activity in schools	<ul> <li>Sports and play equipment will be sanitised before and after use</li> <li>Social distancing will be maximised</li> </ul>	
Educational visits	All educational visits will be risk assessed and will take into account Covid-19 measures	
Provision of food		
Food prepared on premises is compliant with Covid - 19 health and hygiene guidance	<ul> <li>All staff involved in the preparation of food, or the teaching of food technology, have had food hygiene training</li> <li>Staff involved with food preparation will comply with the relevant hygiene related information within <u>Guidance for food businesses on coronavirus</u> (COVID-19)</li> </ul>	
Communications with parents and others		
Parents, contractors and other staff entering or working in the building	<ul> <li>Signs are displayed telling all parents, carers and visitors not to enter the school if they are displaying any symptoms of Covid-19</li> </ul>	
Oversight by directors		
Lack of director oversight during the COVID-19 crisis leads to the school failing to meet statutory requirements	<ul> <li>The directors monitor the school's work remotely using the SchoolPod information management system</li> <li>There are regular phone calls and virtual meetings between the SLT and the Directors</li> </ul>
